Position Overview

Primary Responsibilities

- **Preaching & Teaching**

- **Worship Leadership**
 - Help plan worship services in coordination with the worship leader and volunteers.
 - Administer the sacraments of Baptism and the Lord's Supper.
- **Pastoral Care**
 - Provide counseling, prayer, and visitation to members in need.
 - Conduct weddings, funerals, and special services.
- **Leadership & Administration**
 - Work with Session and church leadership to develop and implement the church's vision.
 - Equip, mentor, and encourage elders, deacons, staff, and volunteers.

- Maintain regular office hours for administration and counseling at church office.
 - Be present and participate in the activities of the church.
 - **Mission & Outreach**
 - Encourage congregational involvement in evangelism, missions, and community service.
 - Represent the church in the local community and EPC denomination.

- Ordained (or ordainable) in the Evangelical Presbyterian Church.
