Position Summary:

We are seeking a dedicated, energetic, and theologically grounded Associate Pastor for Adult Discipleship and Care. This full-time pastor will foster spiritual growth, nurture the congregation's faith, and provide and coordinate pastoral care to our members. The ideal candidate will possess a strong commitment to the Word of God, the Presbyterian tradition, and a passion for walking alongside people in their faith and life challenges.

Key Responsibilities:

1. Adult Discipleship:
